MINUTES OF MEETING

SEPTEMBER 26, 2022 – 6:00 PM

Call meeting to order/adoption of agenda:-

A regular meeting of the Bonavista Town Council was held on Monday, September 26, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. There were six members present; Mayor John Norman, Deputy Mayor Reg Butler, and Councillors Nicole Abbott, David Hiscock, Lindsay Phillips and Colleen Tinkham were present in the Chambers. CAO/Clerk Stephanie Lodge and Youth Representatie Noah Butt was also present.

The meeting was presided over by the Mayor and opened with a prayer.

It was moved by Councillor Hisock and seconded by Deputy Mayor Butler that the agenda of the meeting held on September 26, 2022, be adopted as read with an amendment to include correspondence from Ms. Davina Noble. Motion carried unanimously.

Delegations/Proclamations/Presentations:- None

Adoption of minutes:-

It was moved by Councillor Tinkham and seconded by Councillor Hiscock that the minutes of the meeting held on August 29, 2022 and the special meeting held on September 21, 2022 be adopted as read. Motion carried unanimously.

- 3. It was moved by Councillor Tinkham and seconded by Deputy Mayor Butler that 2017-2021 poll tax for Vickie Sweetland be written off as she did not reside in Bonavista during this time. Motion carried unanimously.

Permits:-

A summary of permits was presented for information/review purposes.

- ➤ 16-20 Phillips Lane proposal A proposal to build 2 residential units on this lot was received, however the total lot size is just below the required regulation by 34m². It was decided to allow this development.
- Permit application for U-Haul business 23-25 Rolling Cove Road It was stated that the land identified in this proposal is in a residential/mixed use zone. This type of business should be conducted in a commercial zone, therefore permit denied.

- ➤ Designation of 36 Russelltown Road as Municipal Heritage Structure It was moved by Councillor Hiscock and seconded by Councillor Tinkham to designate 36 Russelltown Road as a Municipal Heritage Structure under the Town of Bonavista Heritage By-Law. Motion carried unanimously.

- 1. Church Street fence Councillor Phillips questioned what was being done with the old fence pickets on Church Street. It was stated we could use these for maintenance of new fence. It was decided to check with DEO.
- 2. Paving under Capital Works Councillor Phillips questioned what happened to the asphalt that was taken up. It was decided to check with DEO.

Mayor Norman's concerns:-

1. Eastern Health – Mayor Norman provided an update; Eastern Health has made a commitment for no more patient diversions going forward. Virtual care will only be used if absolutely necessary and for emergency situations. A discussion arose concerning the Health Care Vigil that was planned to take place this week at the Bonavista Hospital and the concerns raised by the Health Minister regarding the vigil.

Councillor Abbott's concerns:-

- 1. Parking on Ryans Hill Road (Art Studio) Parking continues to be a problem in this area. CAO stated she has made several requests to Dept. of Transportation without any response.
- 2. Recreation A pre-Halloween event is being planned with Provincial Historic Sites to take place on October 7. It was agreed to allow the Recreation Committee to purchase small prizes for this event.
