A regular meeting of the Bonavista Town Council was held on Monday, December 5, 2022, at 4:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. There were six members present; Deputy Mayor Reg Butler and Councillors David Hiscock, Lindsay Phillips and Barry Randell were present in the Chambers. Mayor John Norman and Councillor Nicole Abbott joined the meeting via videoconference. CAO/Clerk Stephanie Lodge and ECHO Crystal Fudge were also present.

The meeting was presided over by the Mayor and opened with a prayer.

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Butler and seconded by Councillor Hiscock that the agenda of the meeting held on December 5, 2022, be adopted as read. Motion carried unanimously.
