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MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING, OCTOBER 19, 2020

A regular meeting of the Bonavista Town Council was held on Monday, October 19, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in the Garrick Theatre Annex. There were five members present namely Deputy Mayor Stephen Chard, Councillors Lindsay Phillips, Calvin Rolls and Paul Mouland. Mayor John Norman joined the meeting by telephone. Also present at the meeting was the Town Manager/Clerk David Hiscock.

The meeting was presided over by Deputy Mayor and opened with a prayer.

It was moved by Councillor Rolls and seconded by Councillor Phillips that the minutes of the meeting held on September 21, 2020 be adopted as read. Motion carried unanimously.

A discussion then arose concerning the following Councillor concerns:-

## 1. Councillor Rolls concerns:-

- (A) Speed signs on school zones. It was stated that these signs are only operating during school hours. It was agreed to check to see if we can get these working full time.
- (B) Parking in Skiffington's Lane. It was stated that this lane is constantly blocked by a vehicle and it must be rectified. It was agreed to call the owner and advise him that this must be taken care of.
- (C) Street Lights around Town. It was agreed for the Street Lighting Committee to meet next week.

## 2. Councillor Phillips' concerns:-

- (A) Water problem next to Ross Way's on Groves' Lane. Mr. Way is requesting concrete curb and gutter. Ross Faulkner also request curb and gutter on Benny's Road and Allister Fisher on Powell's Lane.
- (B) Bump on Ford's Hill. It was agreed to try and get this bump removed.
- (C) Brown's Hill by Dwayne Sexton's needing repaving. It was agreed to check this matter out and see if we can get this done.
- (D) Route 235 needing paving repairs near Swyer's Bridge. It was agreed to see if we can get this done.
- (E) Council employees learning to drive Council equipment on Council property and on Council time. It was stated that this must stop.
- (F) Councillor Phillips wants to know when Fred Mouland's house in Mockbeggar that belongs to C & M Nfld. Inc. is going to be renovated. Mayor Norman stated there is no plans to do this house this year; however, it is in next years schedule.

- 3. Councillor Mouland's concerns:-
  - (A) Water pressure for houses on Old Quarry Road. It was stated that water pressure is good in this area now.
  - (B) Michael Ryder sign and Adam Pardy sign near Cabot Stadium. It was stated that these signs were taken down because they were dilapidated; however, they must be put back up. It was agreed to ask Bonavista Trinity Minor Hockey Association to design one sign to incorporate both these people.
- 4. Deputy Mayor Chard's concerns:-
  - (A) Poor shape of Trestle. It was stated that we haven't heard anything about funds to remove this trestle.
  - (B) John Templeman with a lot of debris on his property on White's Lane. It was agreed to try and rectify this problem immediately.
  - (C) Shoulder of Neck Road needing pavement to prevent stone from building up on intersection.
  - (D) Culvert on Soper's Lane. It was stated this needs to be replaced since it is collapsed.
- 5. Mayor Norman's concerns:-
  - (A) Tourism Plan for Nfld. & Labrador. Mayor Norman stated that the province is working on a plan for 2021.
  - (B) Bridge House. It was stated that restoration should be approved to start in 2021.
  - (C) Heritage District By-Laws and Regulations and enforcement of them.

A discussion then arose from the business arising out of the minutes:-

- 1. CEEP It was stated that we have \$30,000.00 to do fence around Municipal Park at Cape Bonavista.
- 2. Susan Penney requesting a permit to build a house on 35 Brown's Hill. It was agreed to issue a permit for this dwelling house; however, if they get water and sewer services they must build within one year or the water and sewer service will be removed.

A discussion then arose concerning the following:-

Accounts Payables. The Town Manager/Clerk presented a list of bills for approval to pay. A
copy of this list of bills is attached. It was moved by Mayor Norman and seconded by
Councillor Mouland that these bills in the amount of \$206,303.98 be paid. Motion carried
unanimously.

- 2. Statement of Expenses for Cabot Stadium for September 2020.
- 3. Crazy Horse Lounge being closed from March 15 June 24, 2020 because of COVID 19. It was moved by Mayor Norman and seconded by Councillor Rolls to give the Crazy Horse Lounge a 25% reduction in Business Tax for 2020 since they were forced to close because of COVID 19. Motion carried unanimously.
- 4. Walkham's Gate Pub & Café being closed for at least 3 months because of COVID 19. It was moved by Councillor Rolls and seconded by Councillor Phillips to give Walkham's Gate Pub & Café a 25% reduction in Business Tax for 2020 since they were forced to close because of COVID 19. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Beauty Salons that were closed because of COVID 19. It was moved by Mayor Norman and seconded by Councillor Mouland to give Beauty Salons a 25% reduction in Business Tax for 2020 because they were forced to close for approximately 3 months because of COVID 19. Motion carried unanimously.
- 6. Fire Department requesting a meeting with Council. It was agreed for a Committee of Council to meet with a Committee of the Fire Department at a time convenient to both parties.

Since there was no further business to be discussed, the meeting adjourned at 8:50 p.m.
